Its nuclear arsenal is growing and diversifying. **Part of China's military modernization and economic expansion is due to its access to the U.S. innovation economy, including America's world-class universities.**

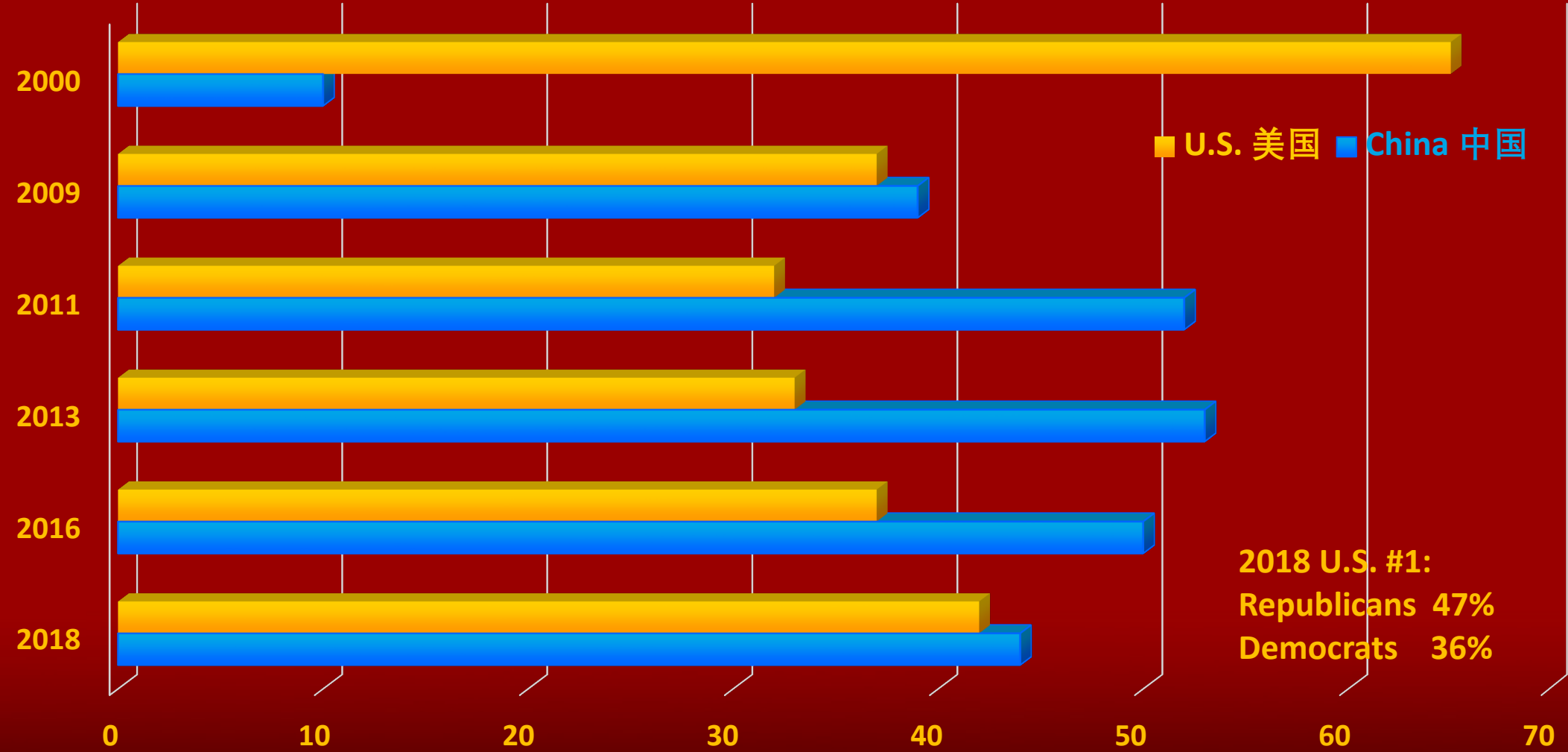

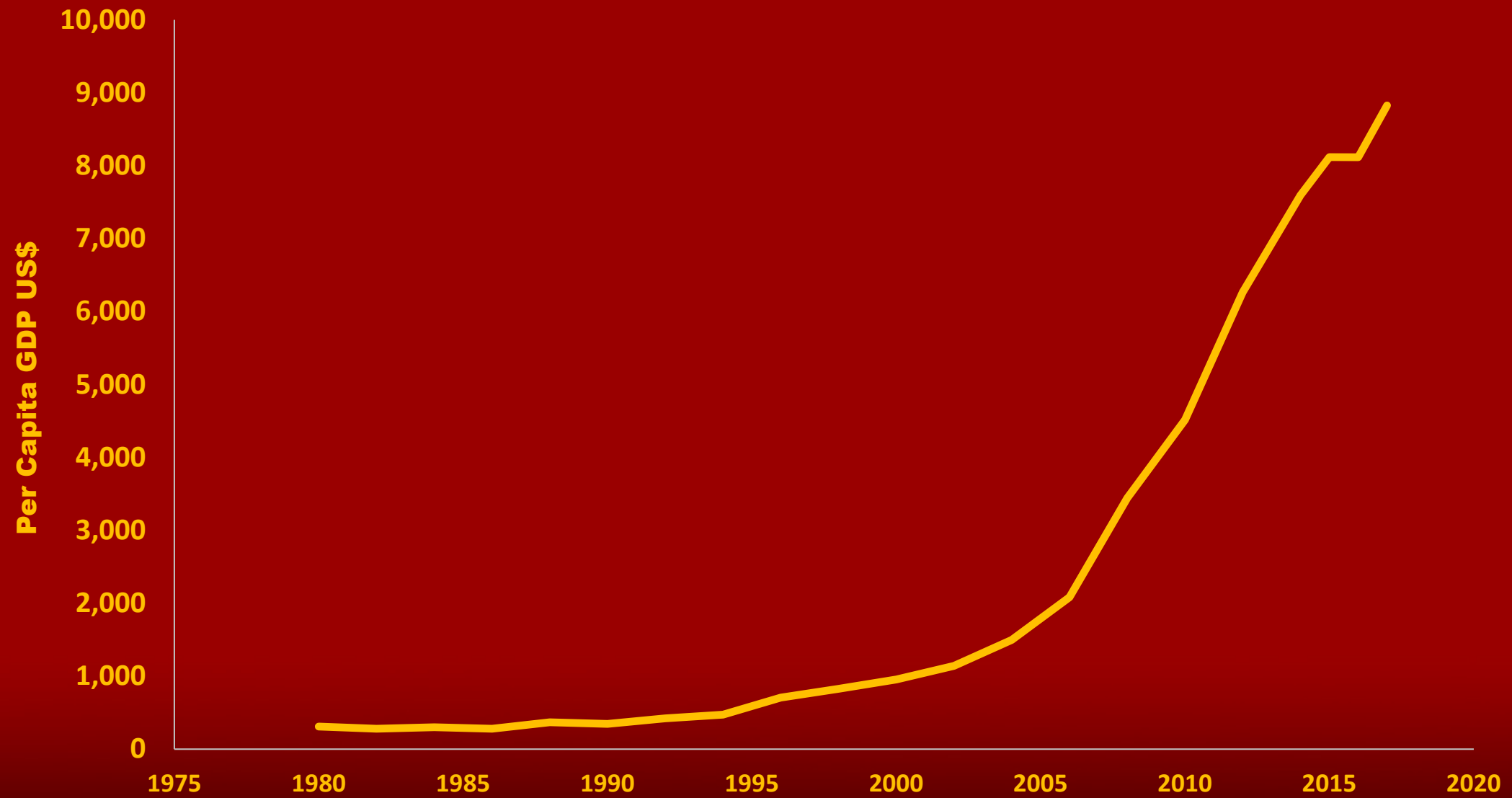


Americans: What country is the leading economic power in the world today?

Crisis on Wall Street as Lehman Totters, Merrill Is Sold, AIG Seeks to Raise Cash

Fed Will Expand Its Lending Arsenal in a Bid to Calm Markets; Moves Cap a Momentous Weekend for American Finance

The American financial system was shaken to its core on Sunday. Lehman Brothers filed for Chapter 11 protection, Merrill Lynch was sold to Bank of America, and AIG sought to raise cash to survive. The weekend's events marked a turning point in the financial crisis, as the Federal Reserve moved to expand its lending powers to help stabilize the system.

LEHMAN BROTHERS
The U.S. government, which had been negotiating a bailout for the firm, announced on Sunday that it would not proceed. Instead, Lehman filed for Chapter 11 protection, the first major investment bank to do so.

MERRILL LYNCH
Bank of America announced that it had agreed to buy Merrill Lynch for \$50 billion. The deal was subject to regulatory approval.

AIG
AIG announced that it was seeking to raise \$150 billion to cover its obligations. The company's credit rating was downgraded, and it faced a loss of confidence from investors.

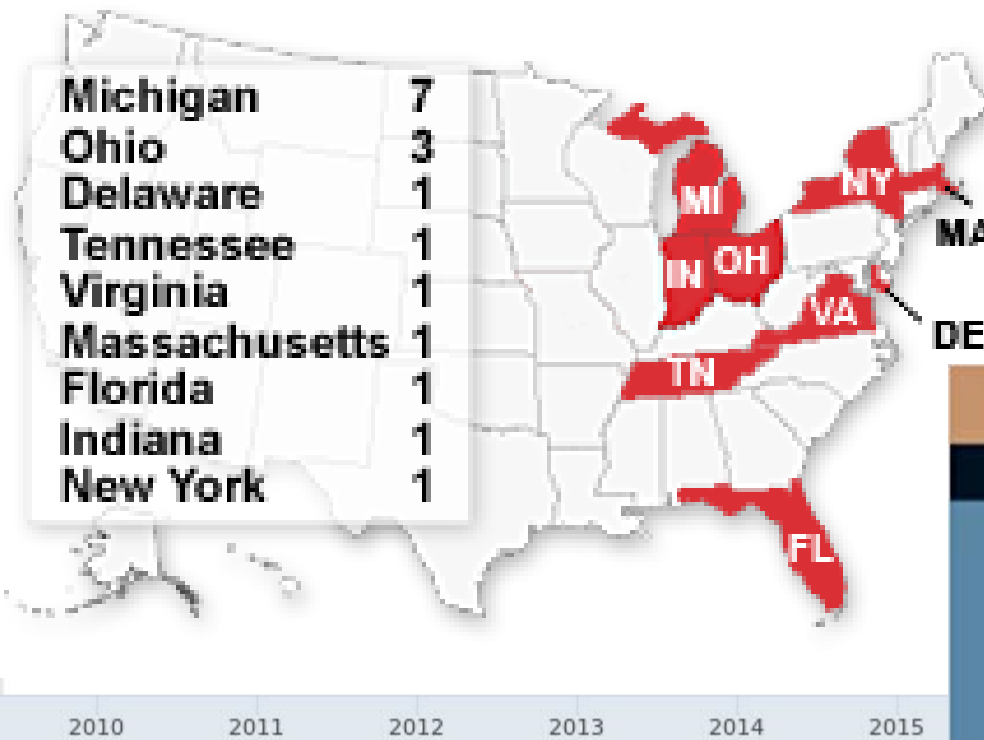

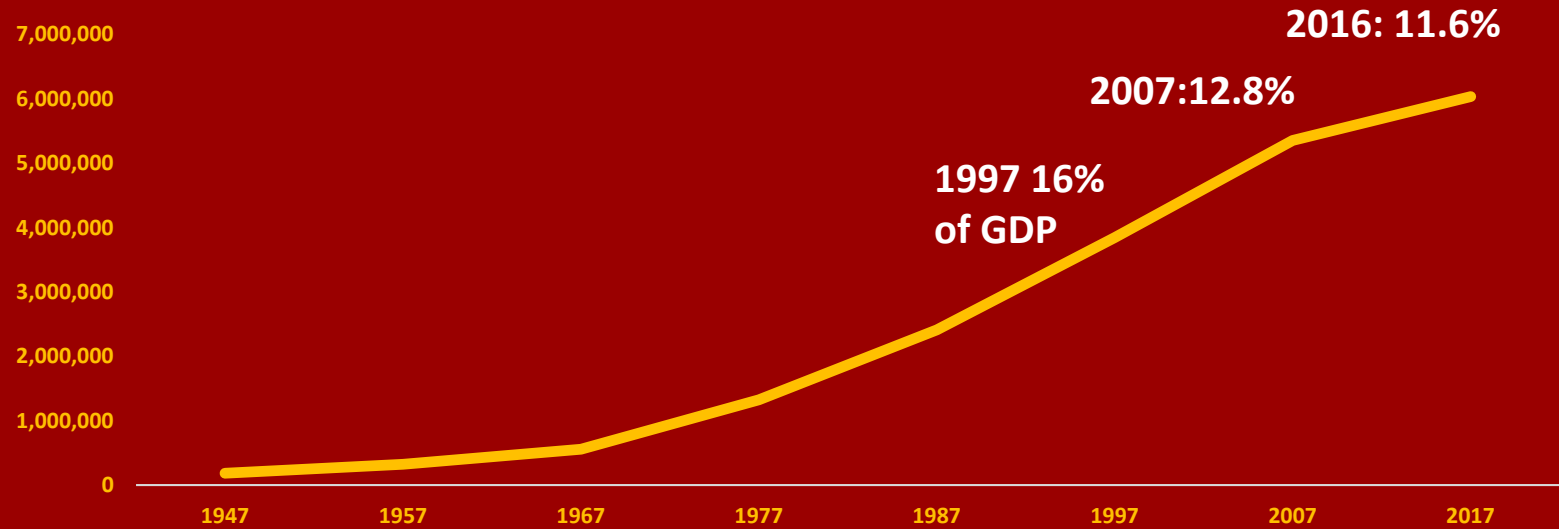

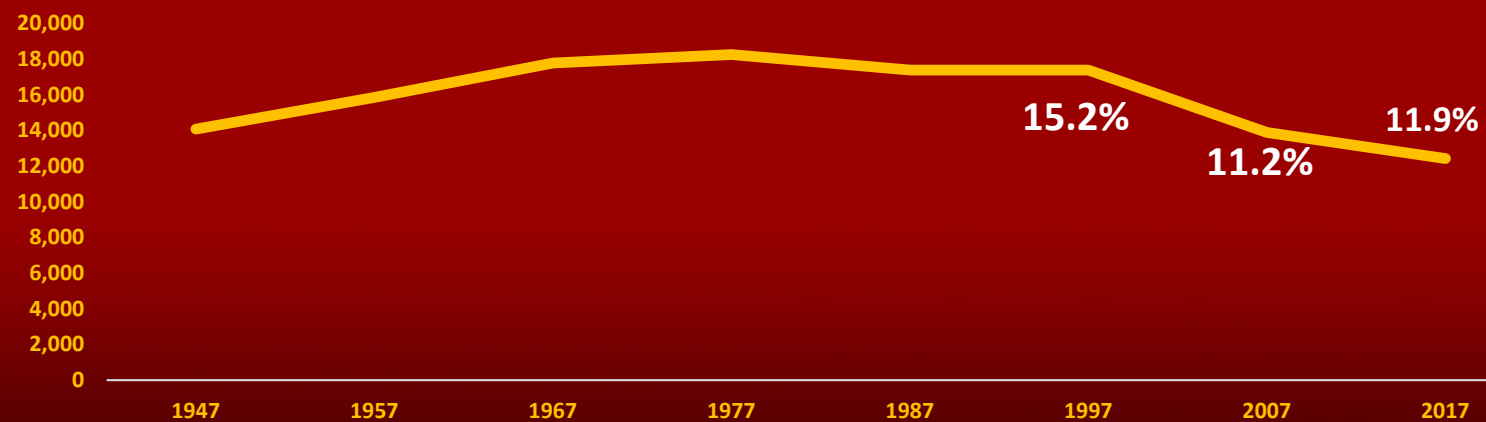
U.S. Manufacturing Output, 1947-2017

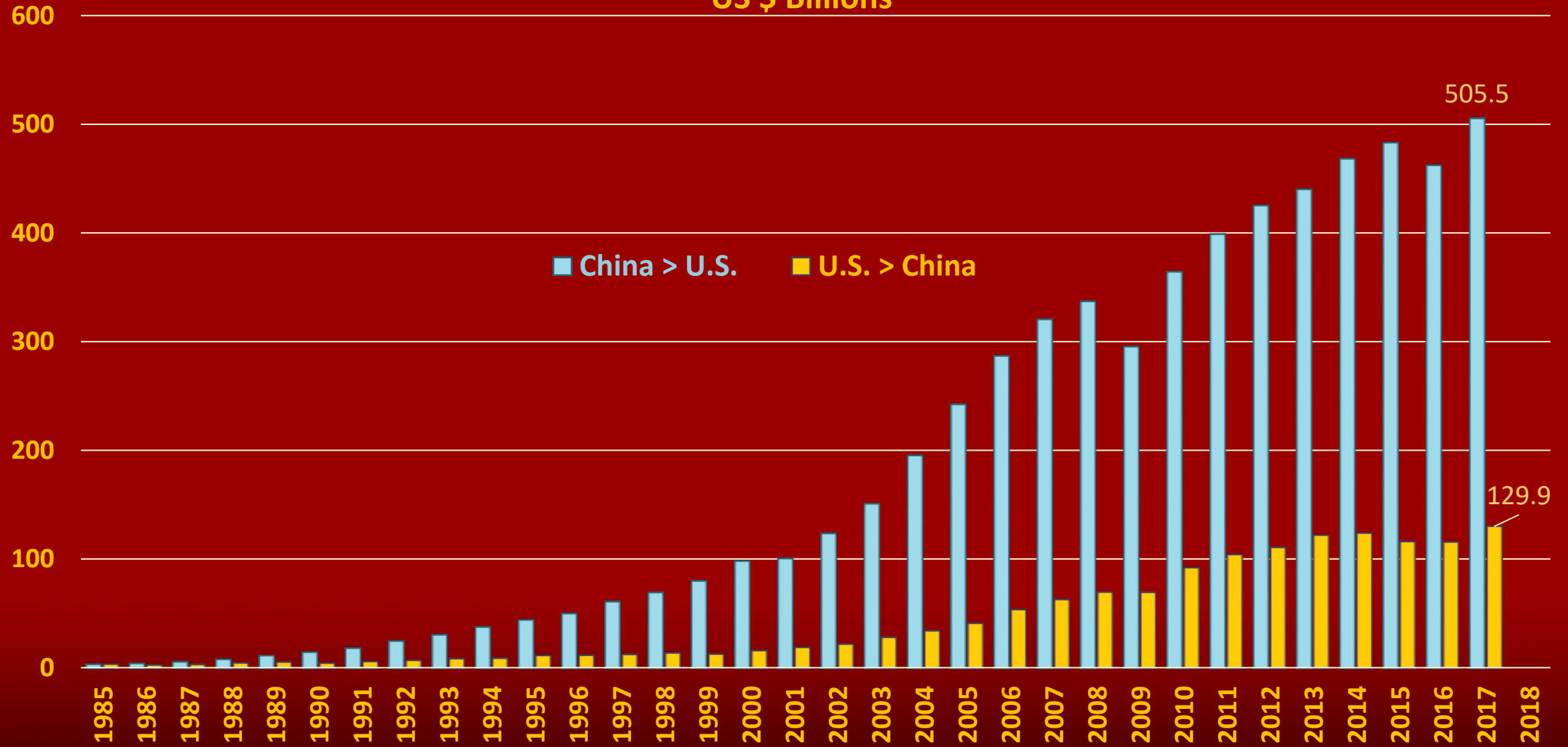

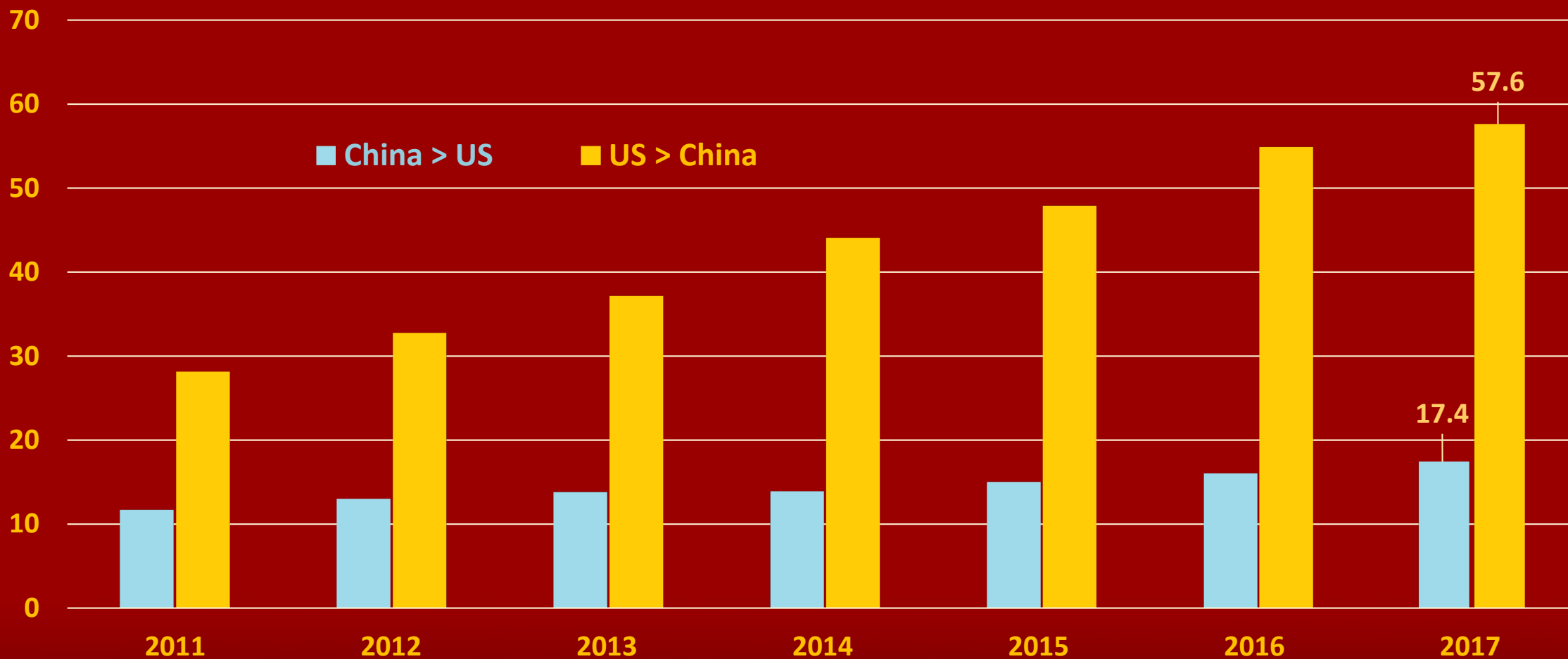
U.S.-China Trade in Goods, 1985-2017



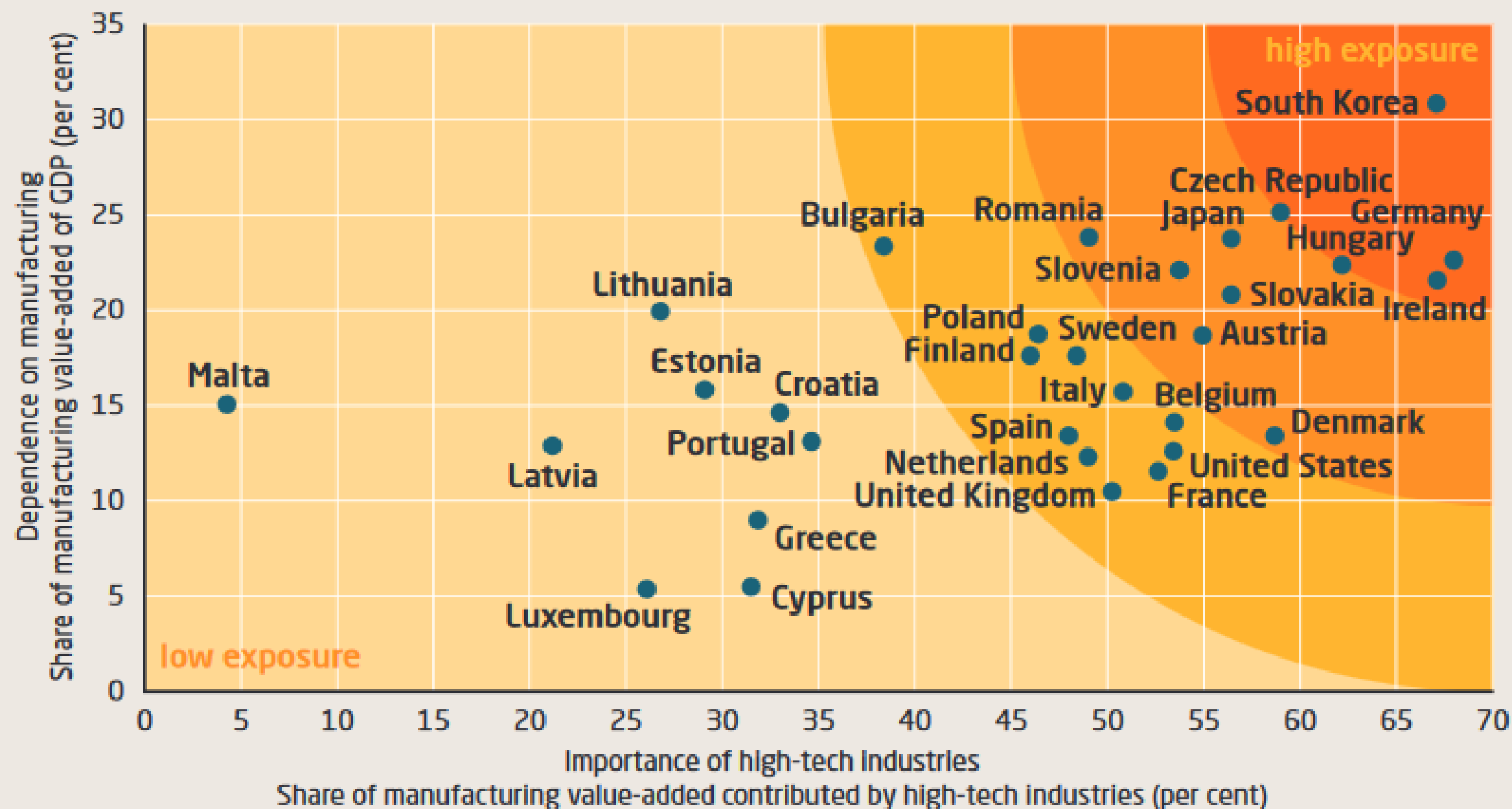

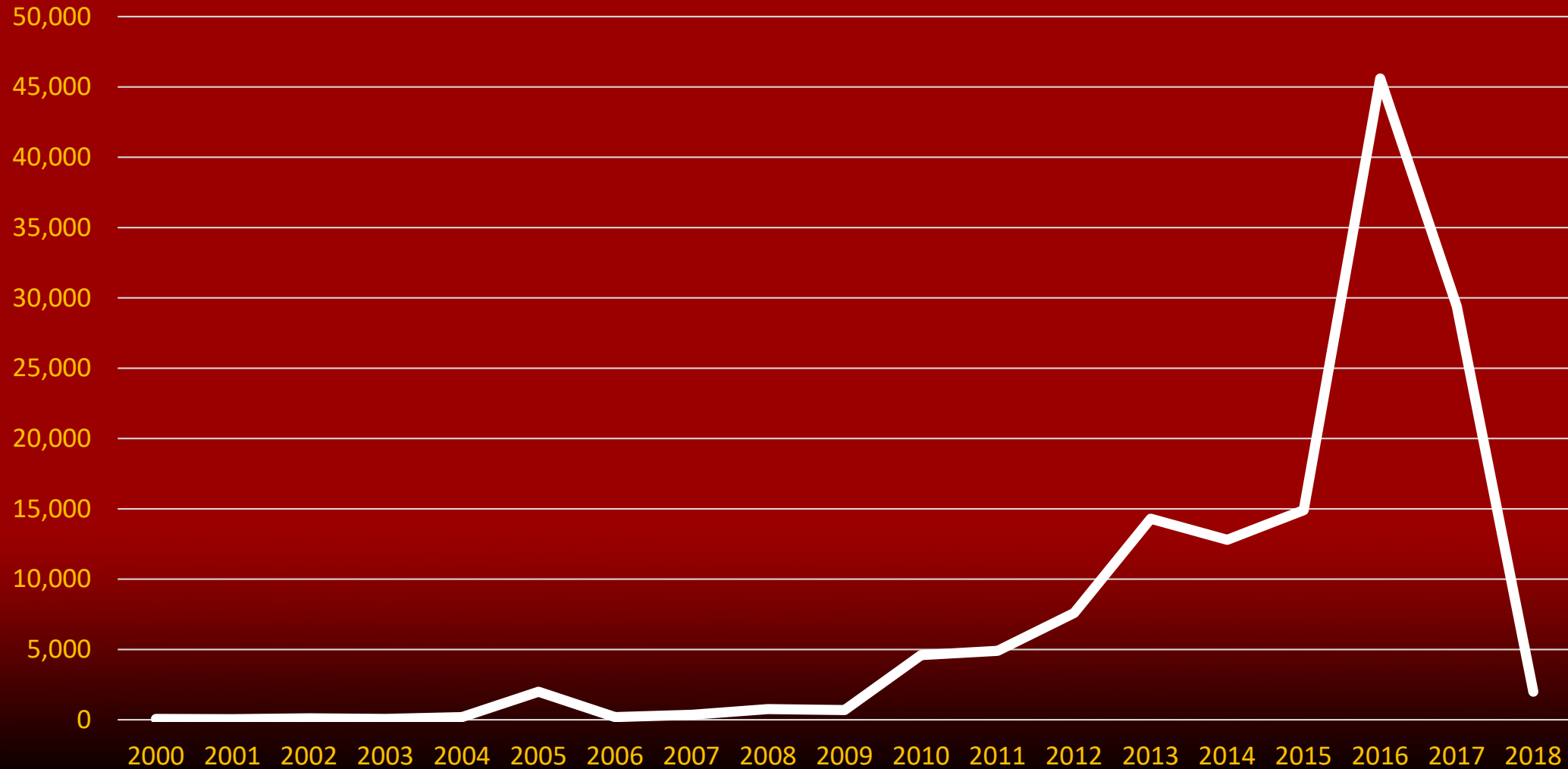

Chinese Investment in the U.S. \$US millions





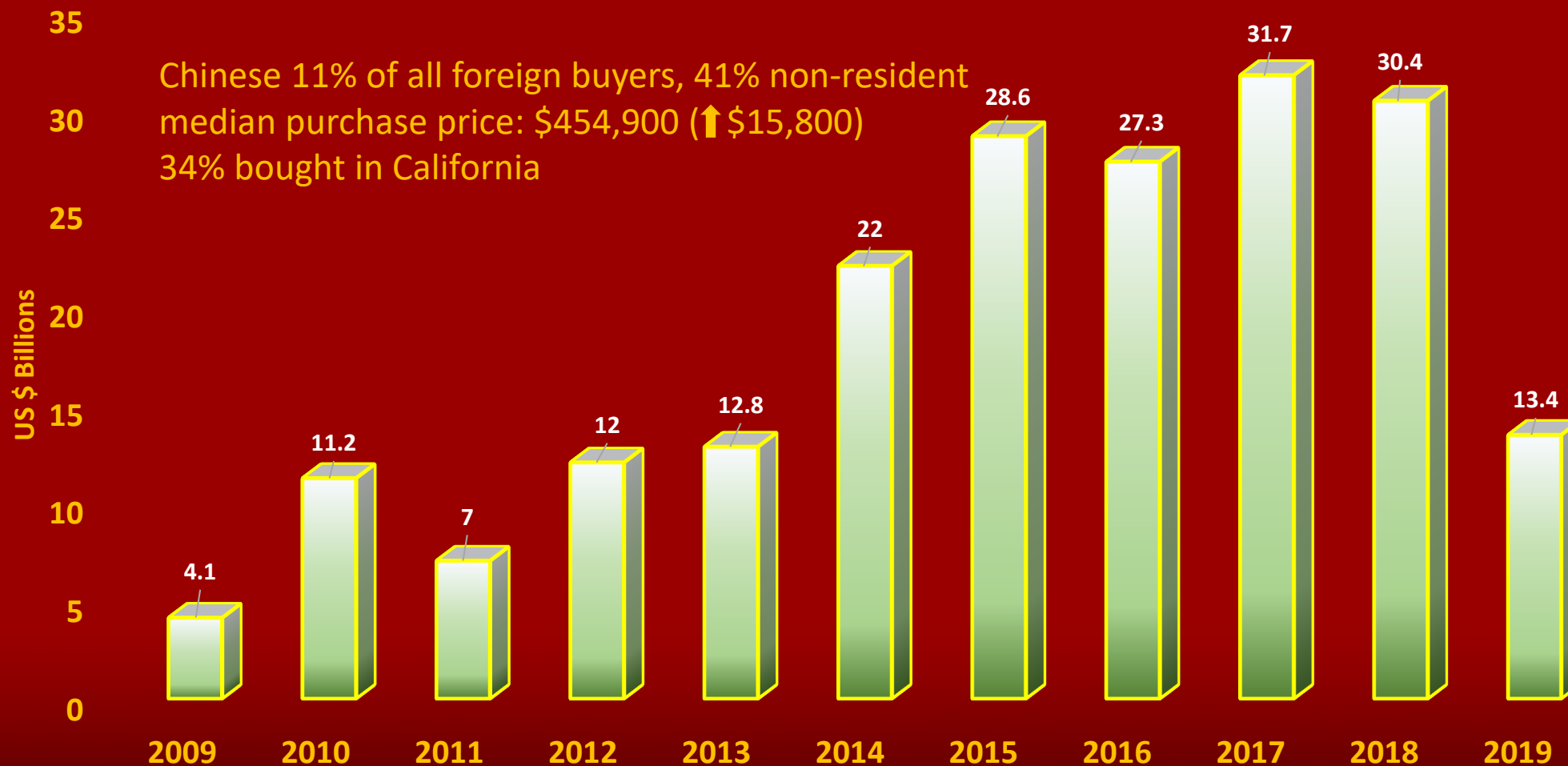

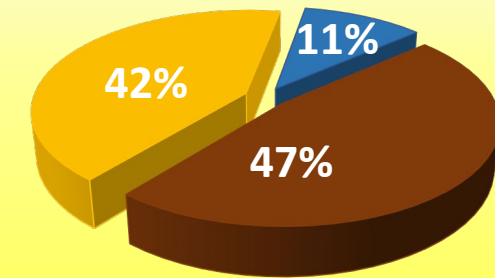

Healthy Life Expectancy at birth, 2015

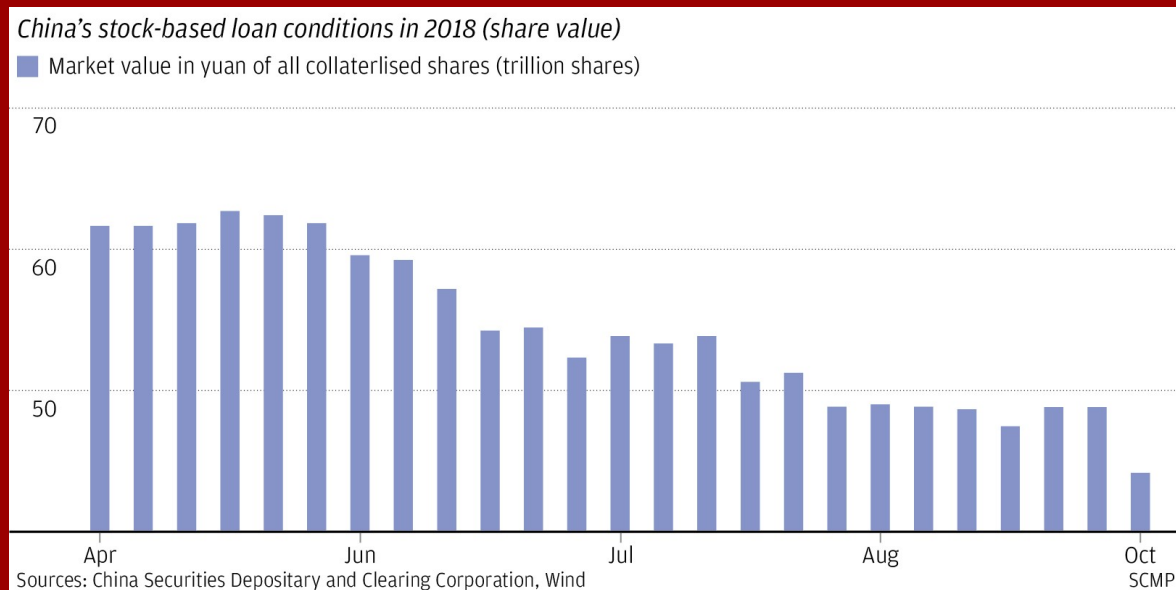

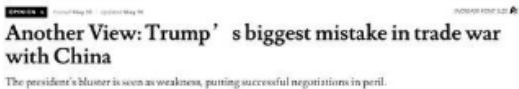
